Internship in Large Animal Medicine, Surgery and Emergency/Critical Care

**Program Description:**

**Rotating hospital internship in Large Animal Medicine, Surgery, and Emergency/Critical Care.**

This program is designed for veterinarians seeking additional clinical training in preparation for private clinical practice or residency specialty training. Interns will play an integral role in all aspects of patient care in the New Bolton Center for Large Animals, under the supervision of boarded specialists and residents. Interns will spend approximately 60% of the year assigned to the Large Animal Surgery service, including equine soft tissue surgery, equine orthopedic surgery, food animal surgery, and critical care/emergency service. The remaining 40% of the time will be assigned to Large Animal Internal Medicine (elective and emergency/critical care), Ophthalmology, and Neonatal Intensive care. Interns will participate in rounds, seminars, and didactic training as provided. Interns will also participate in the teaching programs for veterinary and animal health technician students. After-hours duties on nights and weekends will include admitting and attending emergency admissions and assisting with care of hospitalized patients in concert with emergency clinicians. Interns will participate in the care of all farm animal species, including horses (approximately 75% of caseload), cattle, small ruminants, and camelids. The Widener Hospital has approximately 4500 large animal admissions and 1200 surgical procedures each year.
