Lilies dangerous to cats include:

- Easter lily
- Rubrum lily
- Day lily
- Asiatic lily
- Tiger lily
- Japanese show lily
- Stargazer lily

A cat may vomit, lose its appetite, or become lethargic within a few hours of ingesting a toxic plant. If these symptoms occur, see your veterinarian immediately.

Lily intoxication can cause severe and life-threatening kidney injury requiring advanced medical intervention.
