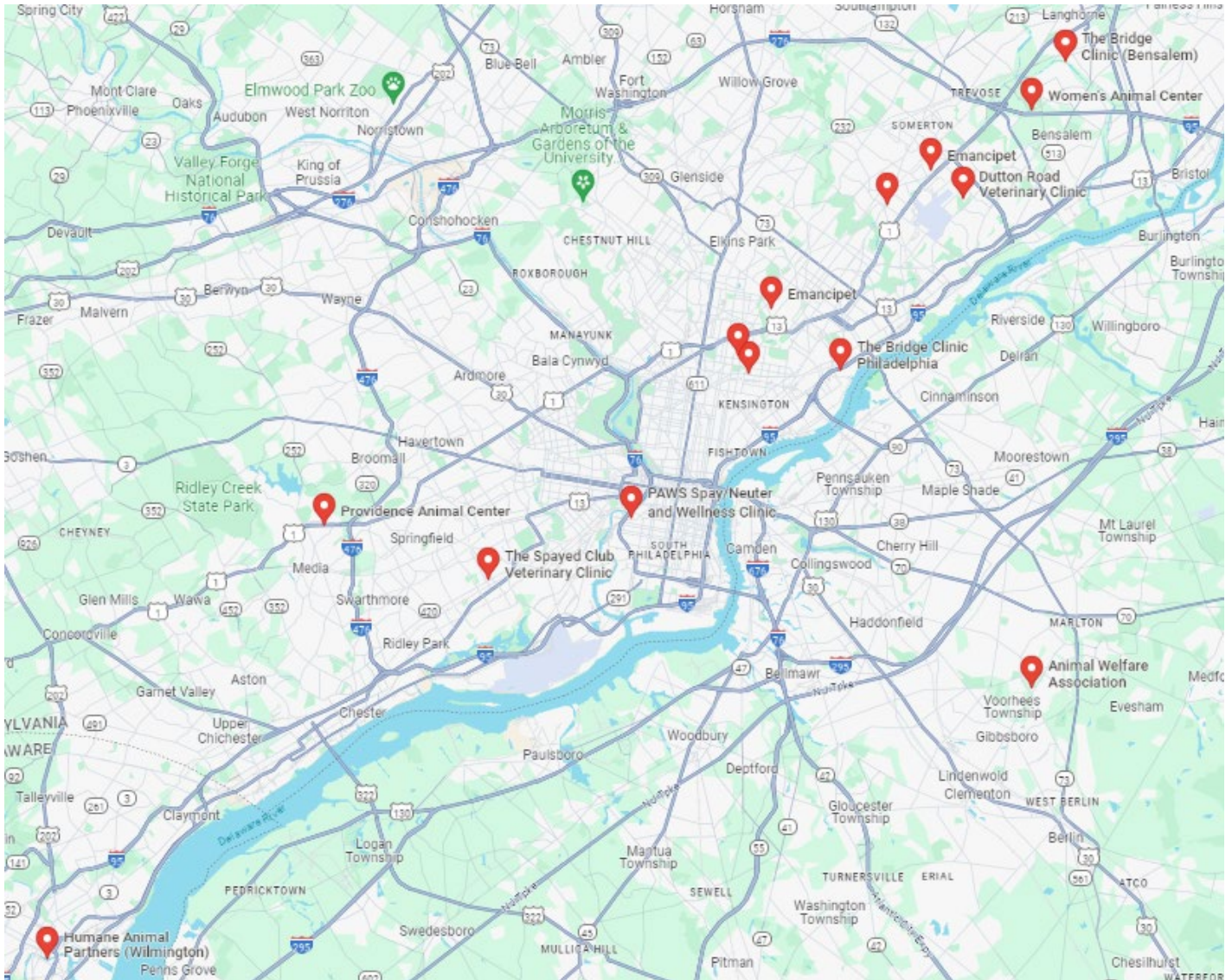

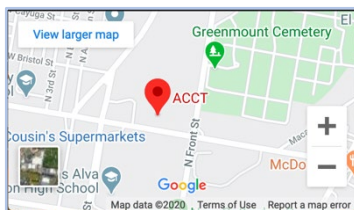

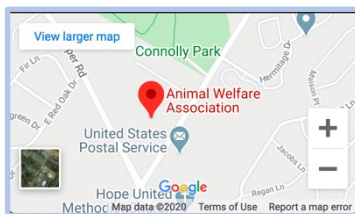

Spay/Neuter

Brachycephalic (short-nosed, for example bulldogs) dogs and cats are not seen at this clinic. If a pet is mixed with a brachycephalic breed, clients must submit pictures. This is due to increased risk under anesthesia for these breeds. Also, all pets 7 years of age and older require bloodwork prior to surgery, for which there is an additional fee.

All brachycephalic breeds require medical department approval before scheduling. Senior animals require pre-surgical bloodwork for an additional cost.
